First Aid Staff and volunteers providing first aid to students will not be expected to maintain 2m distance. The following measures will be adopted: • Washing hands or using hand sanitiser, before and after treating injured student; • Wear gloves when dealing with open wounds; • If CPR is required on an adult, attempt compression only CPR and early defibrillation until the ambulance arrives; • If CPR is required on a student, use a resuscitation face shield if available or perform mouth-to-mouth ventilation in asphyxia arrest • Dispose of all waste safely	First Aid Wearing a face covering or face mask in schools or other education settings is not recommended by PHE. The majority of employees in education settings will not require PPE beyond what they would normally need for their work, even if they are not always able to maintain a distance of 2 metres from others. PPE is only needed in a very small number of cases including; Students whose care routinely already involves the use of PPE due to their intimate care needs should continue to receive their care in the same way If a pupil becomes unwell with symptoms of coronavirus while in their setting and needs direct personal care until they can return home	Principal	Ongoing
